

Anatomy of a pet-friendly home



Pet-proof your window

Keep all unscreened windows closed and make sure adjustable screens are tightly secured.

Cover the trash can

Prevent your pet from rummaging through waste by keeping trash lids secure and tightly fitted.

Keep dangerous items out of sight

Tuck away electric cords and gadgets to prevent your pet from chewing on them, and place breakable items out of the way.

Pet-friendly plants

Choose non-hazardous plants such as cast-iron plant, parlor palm, or rubber plant that are safe for your pet.

Designated potty area

Place the potty in an area that is easy for you and easy for your pet to use.

Install a pet gate

Use a size-appropriate pet gate to cordon off-limits area in your house (e.g. kitchen, electrical room).

Label and store pet food separately

Make sure pet food is clearly labelled and stored away in an area that cannot be accessed by your pet.

Clean feeding area

Put the pet's food and water in a clean space that is inaccessible to pests and insects.

Safe pet toys

Provide your pets with safe, durable, and size-appropriate toys to keep them entertained.

Non-slip floor

Place rubber mats over glossy and slippery floors to prevent your pet from slipping.

Warm sleeping area

Provide a dry and comfortable sleeping area for your pet.
